Fire extinguishers are great for putting out small fires—but only if you use the right one. The wrong extinguisher can make a fire worse. There are five kinds of fire extinguishers.

Class ABC

for combination fires



Class A

Green label—for fires involving:

- ✓ wood
- ✓ paper
- ✓ cloth
- ✓ trash





Class B

Red label—for fires involving:

- ✓ gasoline
- ✓ solvents
- ✓ vapors
- ✓ gas leaks





Class C

Blue label—for electrical fires





Yellow label—for fires involving combustible metals such as:

- ✓ magnesium
- ✓ sodium
- ✓ potassium
- ✓ sodium potassium alloys
